We feel it important to share a fact, that this vaccine expires. They cannot be returned. IF you thought, why the hurry? You now have the 'why'.

In order to accomplish a well-organized flow of students as they receive their immunizations, we ask that you return the required vaccine Consent Forms asap. *If your student is unable to attend this MCV4 clinic on May 29, 2019 but still wants to be vaccinated, arrangements can be made with the Save-On-Foods Pharmacist to be vaccinated at a later date either through the Save-On-Foods Pharmacy or the student's private Health Care Provider.*
