LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND REGULATIONS

Kitimat Scholarship Association awards are restricted to graduates of Kitimat Secondary Schools who qualify as outlined in the individual award criteria, and will pursue post-secondary education at a recognized institute.

If suitable candidates are not selected in the current year, or if graduation status is not maintained, the awards will be forfeited and placed in contingency funds to be awarded at the discretion of the Kitimat Scholarship Association, unless otherwise specified by the donors.

Eligible students should apply by completing the application form provided in this book and returning it to your counselor at Mount Elizabeth Middle/Secondary School, *no later than Friday, May* 15, 2020. Late applications will not be accepted.

An applicant's academic performance will be calculated by MyEdBC (My Education BC) based on a cumulative average of all grade 10, 11 and 12 courses, which now comprise the Graduation Requirements. The exception will be Graduation Transitions and any External Credentials because these do not have a numerical mark attached to them. The final result will be a rank and an unweighted G.P.A. out of 4.0.

- Scholarships and awards may be deferred for one school year if a written request to the Association is received by September 30th in the year in which the scholarship is awarded.
- Awards not claimed by April 30th, 2021 will revert to the Kitimat Scholarship Association.
- Awards are paid in two equal installments (September 2020 & January 2021), upon receipt of proof of tuition cost and course registration at the post-secondary institute for each applicable semester.

** Please note proof of registration is required for each installment. **

• If the recipient requires the scholarship funds prior to paying their post-secondary fees, arrangements can be made by <u>written request</u> to:

to forward payment directly to the Registrar's office at the postsecondary institution for credit to the student's account.

KITIMAT ARTS FOR YOUTH

Fine Arts Scholarship

Kitimat Arts for Youth is sponsoring a \$500.00 scholarship to a student who meets the following criteria:

- The recipient must be a graduating student of MEMSS who has been involved in a KAFY sponsored arts activity for the duration of their time at the school. These activities include band, dance, spoken word, drama and visual arts. Preference will be given to a student continuing their education in the fine arts but this is not a necessity.

If a candidate cannot be filled from one of these KAFY will then look within the band program.

Kitimat Arts for Youth is offering a \$500.00 award to a graduating student from Mount Elizabeth Middle/Secondary School.

This scholarship was originally formed by the Harbord family to honour and remember the dedication to music that former band director Ms. Betty Harbord instilled in her students. It is with her in mind that Kitimat Arts for Youth now sponsors the award for a student who has also shown dedication to the band program.

The graduating student does not need to be pursuing a career in the field of music or fine arts; however, **must** have been part of the band program since elementary school. The student most suitable for this award will be one who has shown a desire to help within the band program, whether with concert set-up, workshops, band camps, band try-out nights or other band related activities. Marks, although considered, will not be the deciding factor.

PURPOSE:

The objective of the scholarship is that by providing eight scholarships of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) students will be encouraged to undertake and successfully complete their academic STEM courses or trades training. FUNDING:

The annual amount given by LNG Canada is twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for eight (8) scholarships of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) each. These funds are to be distributed to four (4) students in Kitimat and four (4) students in Terrace.

SELECTION:

Students in Kitimat will apply to their school Awards Committee through the school's process as per all local scholarships. Students in Terrace will apply to the N.W. Education '88' Foundation and a committee of the Foundation shall select the recipients.

CRITERIA:

To be considered the student must be enrolled in Grade 12 in Kitimat or Terrace and must be planning to attend a post secondary full time academic STEM program or a postsecondary Trades Training Program. The award recipient must be agreeable to being profiled, which includes a personal picture being published in LNG Canada communications material.

REDEMPTION:

To claim the scholarship, the recipient must prove, within thirty-four (34) months of the award being received, proof of registration in an educational program at a recognized post-secondary institution.

The scholarship will be paid in one installment of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). The payment will be paid upon proof of registration in an academic STEM program or enrolment in a trades training program or a subsequent period of their trades training or apprenticeship training.
